# Place in Crib Upstairs A need we all can Get behind

#### LAST FRIDAYS RETURN, SO DOES FBC...WITH YOUR HELP. There are two (2) action items, please read it through.

Last Fridays return to Hillsborough in May. FBC plans to be there, as well. It depends upon who is willing to help. FBC's presence at Last Fridays began with a discussion of the Deacons in Spring 2018. It was, "How can we have a simple presence in this community event?" The basic overview was that the people of the community can be met and we are there because FBC cares about the community of which we are a part. It was to create moments of engagement and conversation. The primary focus is not intended to be a recruiting tool for FBC, yet that sometimes happens as an honest by-product. The aim of just meeting people was the simple goal and that remains. The Deacons have supported this over the years. As all things evolve over time, so has this over the years and continues to as we move forward.

The Deacons, for a variety of reasons, wish for this to become part of the regular opportunities of missions within FBC. Thus, this ministry will be appealing for a broader level of support from the church and less dependent upon the Deacons for foundational support. Financially, the support remains. It is the involvement of people where the primary shift is occurring.

#### (Cont'd)

Last Fridays are a part of a larger offering by the Hillsborough Arts Council (HAC). There are events on the last Friday of the month across spring, summer and fall. The event of "Last Friday" is just the months of May until October. Last Friday in October is Halloween and we will not participate because of our Trunk-or-Treat. Therefore, we will only participate from May through September (5 times).

For our presence there, we have the general equipment for the event. We have the financing. We are fortunate that people now expect us to be there. We continue the plan of popcorn, candy and handouts to share while we have conversations. That conversation IS THE GOAL. The conversation can take many forms and topics that are comfortable and welcoming. In telling the HAC what we do, it falls under the term "Hospitality." So, that does describe what we do and why we are there. We wish to simply show hospitality to people and it comes to them from a church of caring people with no strings attached.

There are two (2) things we need. The first of these is people willing to show up to offer this "hospitality." A format suggested here is the groups of Adult Sunday School Classes, Youth, Choir and Deacons each sign up for one month out of the five. So, leaders of those groups, please let Stephen Durham know ASAP which month your group decides, (May 30, June 27, July 25, August 29 or September 26). Typically, the need is about five (5) people willing to commit each month. More hands make for lighter work, so if there are 6, 8, or 10, that is great! Let Stephen Durham know of your decision about helping as a group soon please.

The second thing is a unique niche that adds so richly to the experience. This fresh thing is simple children-specific activities that can typically be done in about ten (10) minutes. These are VBS-type things, (make a bracelet, a necklace, color something, glue a form together, etc.). This began last summer and was a brilliant addition. Linda Riggins has offered to coordinate this across the summer this year. If you find satisfaction in helping children experience things like VBS, this might just be for you! We typically need 1 or 2 individuals for each event whose interest has a child's focus to shape it, guide it and equip it. PLEASE let Linda know of your availability!

So, please find ways to support this. Please be generous in your agreement to help out. Please explore if your talents/gifts can include helping children have ten (10) minutes of enjoyment (teenagers and parents can also participate by the way). This is a low-stress commitment for just a few hours once over the summer. Please joinin as we share in the community as a community church. Thank you ALL!
